






### Import Export Code (IEC)



### What is IEC?

IEC Code is unique 10 digit code issued by DGFT - Director General of Foreign Trade, Ministry of Commerce,

Government of India to Indian Companies and Individuals to enable them carry International Trade.



### History of the Code

A citizen or a company starting a business for International trade must register the Company with the Director of Foreign Trade under the Ministry of Foreign Trade, to obtain an IE Code number, then only one can export materials to other countries and import materials from other countries to India.

Before 1997, it is essential to obtain this I.E Code number from the Reserve Bank of India, for every first time exporter for his export operations. Later, this work being done by Director General of Foreign Trade under the Ministry of Foreign Trade, Government of India.

DGFT provides every exporter an unique Import Export Code Number. IE Code Number is a ten digits code required for the purpose of export as well as import. No exporter can export his goods abroad without IEC number.

Exceptions are there for export to Nepal, Myanmar to China through Gunji or Nathuala ports. If the CIF value of a single consignment does not exceed Indian amount of Rs. 25,000/ - there is no need to obtain IE code number for export to the above destinations.

### **Documents required?**

- Bank Certificate (ANF- 2A)/a pre-printed canceled cheque
- ☐ Identity card (Aadhar card, license, passport, etc.)
- ☐ Address proof of the company/ Firm
- ☐ Current Bank Account Details
- □ A copy of the self- attested PAN card
- ☐ Two passport size photos (attested by the banker of the individual)
- ☐ Covering letter on the letterhead of the company- requesting to issue IEC
- ☐ Receipt of the Paid Application fee

### Cases where IEC is not mandatory?

- According to the latest circular issued by the government, IEC is not mandatory for all traders who are registered under GST. In all such cases, the PAN of the trader shall be construed as new IEC code for the purpose of import and export.
- ☐ Import Export Code (IEC) isn't required to be taken in case the goods exported or imported is for personal purposes and isn't used for any commercial

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any commercia purpose.

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### Things to know before applying for IEC

Any exporter or importer is eligible to apply for an IEC before initiating international dealings. Further, there is an option of using an individual's name or the company's name while applying for the code. However, an application fee of Rs. 500 is charged along with with the application form, Aayaat Niryaat Form (ANF) 2A format. As mentioned earlier, DGFT under the Ministry of Commerce, the Government of India oversees issuing IEC. Also, nowadays it is issued in e- IEC by the said department following the guidelines of Foreign Trade (Regulation) Rules, 1993.

### Benefits of IEC

- Availing benefits from customs that are from Export Promotion Councils (EPC) and DGFT
- □ It can easily elevate the establishment because it is a universally recognized identification. Thereby, transforming the individual into a registered exporter and proving access across the globe
- Highlight that, no annual fee pertaining to maintenance and retaining of the code. That is, on attaining an IEC is valid throughout life and need not be renewed.
- ☐ Importantly, any transactions done using IEC will remain documented, hence it can act as a form of proof in case of defaulters or faulty accusations.

### Exempted Categories from obtaining IEC

- $lue{}$  Importers and exporters under clause 3 of the Foreign Trade Order, 1993
- lacksquare Minister or department belonging to Central or State government.
- ☐ Any exporter or importer, dealing for personal use instead of being related to trade, manufacturing, or agriculture.
- ☐ In case exporting from Nepal, the CIF value should not exceed Rs 25,000.
- □ Similar fashion follows for imports from Myanmar and Indo- Myanmar border areas where the CIF value of one shipment must not exceed Rs 25,000.
- □ SCOMET (Special Chemicals, Organisms, Materials, Equipment, and Technologies) export trade has no eligibility to use IEC.

### Case study Hive



Goyal & Co (const.) (P.) Ltd. v DCIT [Ahem Trib]

Where assessee failed to deposit entire amount towards employees contribution on account of PF and ESI with concerned department on or before due date prescribed under relevant statutes, assessee would not be entitled to deduction under section 36(1)(va)



HHA Tank Terminal (P.) Ltd. v. ITO [Koch HC]

Where assessee having filed original return, revised same by filing another return claiming enhanced amount of refund, in such a case, delay in claiming enhanced refund could only be attributed to assessee and, thus, interest on higher refund was payable only from date of filing revised return

CIT v. TVS Motors Ltd. [Kel HC]

When object of expenditure was not for bringing into existence a new asset or to obtain a new advantage, said expenditure qualified to be considered as current repairs under section 31

Professor P.N. Shetty v. ITO [Kar HC]

Where only a part of amount deposited in Capital Gains Account Scheme was utilized for construction or purchase of a new asset within specified time of three years, income tax was chargeable on remaining unutilized amount in previous year in which period of three years expired

Badri Narain Kanta Devi Katta Charitable Trust v. CIT [Jaipur Trib]

Sec. 80G approval couldn't be denied just on ground that no activities had been started towards objects of trust

Rural Communication and Marketing (P.) Ltd. v. DCIT [Del Trib]



The assessee was engaged in the business of rural marketing, promotions, roadshows, display advertising etc. It claimed depreciation at higher rates on the ground that those vehicles were main source of income and the charges for vehicle used were termed as hire charges. ITAT held that higher rate of depreciation is admissible only if vehicles are used in the business of running them on hire and restricted the Depreciation to 15%.





### Akash Goyal v. ACIT [Agra Trib]

Where assessee borrowed funds and utilised them for lending money to various parties, interest paid by assessee on money borrowed was to be allowed under section 57(iii) even if it did not earn interest income on money lent by it

#### Sudip Rungta v. DCIT [Kol Trib]

Performance bonus does not form part of 'salary' as defined in clause (h) of Rule 2A purpose of computing exemption under section 10(13A). Thus, assessee would be entitled to house rent allowance to extent of excess of rent paid over 10 per cent of salary

### Uday Gopal Bhaskarwar v. ACIT [Pun Trib]

Loss suffered during first year of business started with husband's fund is to be clubbed entirely: Assessee gifted a sum of money his wife, who started business of Futures and Options (F&O) on 18-09-2013. ITIT upheld the assessee's contention as going by the explanation 3 read in conjunction with section 64(1)(iv), the entire amount of loss resulting from the business is liable to clubbed in hands of assessee.

### Amendments on Covid-19 Crisis



#### Income Tax

- Last date for filing Income Tax Returns for FY 2018-19 has been extended from 31st March 2020 to 30-Jun-2020
- The interest rate for delayed payment of tax for FY 2018-19 reduced from 12% to 9%
- While no extension has been provided for payment of TDS, the interest rate for late payment has been reduced from 18% to 9% for payments made up to 30-Jun-2020
- Date for linking of Aadhar with PAN extended from 31st March 2020 to 30-Jun-2020
- Vivad se Vishwas tax dispute resolution scheme - No interest will be levied if the payment under the scheme is made before 30-Jun-2020

#### Goods and Service Tax

- Last date for filing Feb, Mar and Apr returns and composition returns extended till last week of 30-Jun-20 with due dates in a staggered manner.
- No interest, late fee and penalty will be charged for companies with turnover < Rs.5 crore.
- No late fees and penalty will be charged for companies with turnover > Rs.5 crores. However, interest at 9% will charged for delayed payment of tax for the month March 2020 to May 2020.
- Last date for opting the composition scheme has been extended to 30th June 2020.

#### Companies Act

- No additional fees for late filing during a moratorium period from 01-Apr-20 to 30-Sep-20, in respect of any document, return, statement etc., to be filed in the MCA-21.
- The mandatory requirement of holding Board meetings within 120 days provided in the Companies Act, 2013, is extended by a period of 60 days till the next two quarters 30-Seρ-20.
- CARO 2020 will be applicable from the FY 2020-21 instead of from FY 2019-20 as notified earlier.
- Newly incorporated companies are required to file a declaration of commencement of business within 6 months of incorporation, however, the same is extended by further 6months.
- For FY 2019-20, waiver of requirement for the Independent Directors to hold a separate meeting without the attendance of non-independent directors and members of management
- Non-compliance of minimum residency in India for a period of at least 182 days by at least one director of every company, under Section 149 of the Companies Act, will not be treated as a violation.
- The requirement to create a Deposit reserve of 20% of deposits maturing during the financial year 2020-21 before 30-Apr-20 shall be allowed to be complied with till 30-Jun-20.
- The requirement to invest 15% of debentures maturing during a particular year in specified instruments before 30-Apr-20, maybe done so before 30-Jun-20

#### **Others**

- Threshold limit of default under the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code has been increased from Rs flac to Rs fcrore which will prevent insolvency proceedings against MSMEs.
- Waiver of minimum balance charges for savings bank accounts upto 30-Jun-20
- Debit card holders can withdraw cash from any bank ATM without any charges for next three months.
- o Bank charges for digital trade transactions reduced.
- permitted Banks to give 3-month moratorium period term loans & OU EMI's: however. interest OΠ the outstanding loans shall continue to be charged.
- Central bank has also slashed repo rate by 75 basis points


